

NJ Common Sense Shared Services Act Advances

The New Jersey State Senate and General Assembly held voting sessions on Monday, June 24th and Thursday, June 27th. While normally these final sessions are the last before a summer recess, it appears that both houses will be returning at some point in July to complete some unfinished business.

Included is, A-1401 (**now substituted by [S-533](#)**), which is known as the “**Common Sense Shared Services Act.**” This bill is **supported** by the New Jersey League of Municipalities (NJLM). The bill was amended and approved on the floor of the Assembly on Thursday, June 27. The bill must now go back to the State Senate for concurrence.

In its June 28th Legislative Recap for the week of June 24, NJLM reports that it has not reviewed the amendments, but will review and advise accordingly.
